EICHORST RECEIVES SOCIAL SCIENCE WRITING AWARD

CHARLESTON, IL--Doreen Eichorst, daughter of Joan Eichorst of Elmhurst, is the recipient of a Social Science Writing Award at Eastern Illinois University.

The writing competition was sponsored by Eastern's

Departments of Economics, History, Political Science, Psychology
and Sociology and recognizes outstanding research papers written
by students in upper division social science courses.

Students must display excellent use of English, organization, creativity in topic development and resource usage, quality of information and its suitability for the topic of the paper, quality of documentation, synthesis of information and validity of conclusions.

The award recipients are chosen by Eastern's Social Science Writing Award Selection Committee composed of a faculty member from each of the participating departments. The dean of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences presides over the committee.

Eichorst's winning paper was titled "The Role of Expectancy

Strategies."
