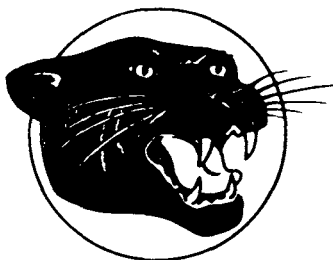

REVIEWING THE WEEKEND (Sept. 10-11)

FOOTBALL: After falling behind 17-0 at halftime, EIU broke loose in the fourth quarter to win its second straight of the '82 season, 18-17, over Northeast Missouri. Kevin Staple (Markham-Thornwood) was named the offensive 'player of the game' as he rushed for 125 yards, 110 coming in the second half, and scored 4th quarter TDs of eight and 10 yards. Bill Mines (Washington, DC-Woodson) earned defensive 'player of the game' honors as he recorded 12 tackles including three solos and forced the fumble that set up the game winning touchdown.

Other segment 'players of the game' were Bob Norris (Pittsfield) for the offensive line, Jim Schmidt (DeKalb) for the receivers, Keith Wojnowski (St. Anne-Kankakee Bishop McNamara) for the defensive line and Charlie Person (Chicago-Dunbar) for the secondary.

Norris led the line's fourth quarter resurgence that produced the offensive stimulus, Schmidt caught two passes for 32 yards, Wojnowski had five tackles, a quarterback sack and recovered a fumble that set up the winning score and Person had four tackles.

SOCCER: EIU took third in the Mayor's Cup tournament at Oneonta (NY) State. The Panthers lost to the host team 2-1 but then downed Air Force Academy by an identical score. Agyeman Prempeh (Kumasi, Ghana) scored two of the weekend goals and Guy Callipari (London, Canada) picked up the other. EIU is now 2-1.

MEN'S X-COUNTRY: Tim Warneke (Park Forest-Crete-Monee) paced EIU to a 27-28 victory over Southeast Missouri. He finished the five mile course in a winning time of 24:55, 43 seconds ahead of the No. 2 runner. The margin of victory was provided by sophomore Aaron Shepley (Crystal Lake) whose 10th place finish in 26:51 was just two seconds ahead of SEMO's next runner. A reversal of those places would have given SEMO the one-point win. Other EIU scorers were John Gassmann (Olney-East Richland), 3rd in 25:46; Perry Edinger (Mattoon), 4th in 25.49; and Joel McKinney (Niantic-Harris-town), 9th in 26:46.

WOMEN'S X-COUNTRY: The Panthers were third in the six-team 5000 meter race at Purdue. EIU had 60 points as Purdue won with 16 taking five of the top six places. Gina Sperry (Litchfield) was Eastern's top finisher at 5th place in 18:20. Margaret Smith (Effingham-St. Anthony) was 8th in 18:49.

FIELD HOCKEY: EIU split opening season games on the road beating Valparaiso 6-0 and losing to Ball State 2-0. Deb Seybert (Edwardsville) scored four goals as EIU took a record 52 shots in the Valpo win. Seybert had 13 of those shots. Valpo didn't have one shot-on-goal. EIU had just seven shots in the Ball State loss.

VOLLEYBALL: The Panthers downed Western Illinois to boost its record to 5-1 with a five match winning streak. Sheila Rogers (Litchfield), seeing her first action of the season, served 15 straight point winners in the 4th game as EIU won 15-2.
