HOHENGARTEN REPLACES TABER AS DEAN AT EASTERN

CHARLESTON, IL--Frank Hohengarten has been named Eastern Illinois University's dean of student academic services, effective July 1.

He replaces Sam Taber who will begin administrative leave the same day and retire December 31.

Taber recently received the Livingston C. Lord Distinguished Service Award, the University's most prestigious service honor, during Founder's Day activities.

HOHENGARTEN AS DEAN

As dean of student academic services, Hohengarten will oversee the areas of admissions, high school relations, community college relations, records, registration and textbook rental service.

Since 1988, Hohengarten, who holds a doctorate in educational leadership from the University of Tulsa, has been acting director of resident and student affairs and associate director for placement, alumni, and postgraduate affairs at the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine in Tulsa. He also served as adjunct instructor in psychiatry and behavioral sciences.

He joined the University of Oklahoma staff in 1988 after 12 years at Oklahoma State University's College of Osteopathic Medicine, where he served as registrar and director of student services.

After receiving his bachelor's degree in psychology from Drury College in Springfield, Missouri, Hohengarten attended the University of Tulsa where he earned a master's in educational administration and his doctorate.
