CHARLESTON, IL.--Sixteen students from three Coles County high schools have been named the second recipients of the Lulu Craig Collier Scholarship Fund administered through the Eastern Illinois University Foundation.

These award winners are Laura Ankenbrand, Julie Dobbs, Christine Lenkey, Cristi Ruddell, Stuart Tart, Sarah Williams and Kristi Young of Charleston High School; Anthony Alvis, Bryan Burrell, Jamey Frick, Andrew Lucas, Kent Reel, Gregory Smith and Teresa Welton of Mattoon High School; and Korrel Crawford and Jay Hanner of Oakland High School.

These 16 will receive a cash stipend from EIU which is the beneficiary of a bequest from the estate of Lulu Craig Collier.

An endowment fund has been set up through the EIU Foundation "in order that the income therefrom may be used to provide scholarships, or books, tuition and fees, for students from Coles County, Illinois, who have graduated from any one of the public high schools in Coles County."

To be eligible for this award, these students have graduated in the upper twenty five percent of their high school class and shall have stated in writing their intent to enroll at EIU.

Selections were made by Dr. Glenn Williams, vice president for Student Affairs, upon recommendation of the high school principals or their designees.
