

CHARLESTON, IL--Bonnie Fisk (Evansville, IN-Castle) is a junior starter for Eastern Illinois University volleyball team. The 5-10 junior hitter-middleblocker had an outstanding 32% attack efficiency in last weekend's (Oct. 15-16) Panther Invitational.

Fisk has started 35 of the Panthers' 36 matches and leads EIU in attack efficiency with just under a 28% clip. She is second to Stacy Cook in kills (255-303) and third in total attempts (610) behind Donna Uhler (800) and Cook (777).

Head Coach Carol Gruber said, "Bonnie is a major factor in our offense and has both quickness and court-sense she's a very effective middle-blocker."

Fisk ranks just behind Cook in block solos with 72 (Cook has 76) earning six in the four matches last weekend. Bonnie also is second to Cook in block assists with 89 (Cook has 92).

She has improved her serving committing just 11 errors in her last dozen matches. She has attempted 100 serves since the Hawkeye Invitational earlier this month and is second to Cook in service aces with 31 (Cook has 42).

"Bonnie has a fine ability to hang in the air and put the ball wherever she chooses," Gruber continued. "She simply overpowers any defense which tries to stop her."

Fisk was selected to the 1980 Illinois AIAW Division II squad. She is the daughter of Penny Cotton of Evansville, IN.
