Calvin currently serves as the chairman for the International Business, Inc., where he advises major financial organizations in the United States, Europe and the Pacific basin on international issues and strategy.

After attending Eastern, he earned a law degree from the University of Illinois in 1956. He then practiced law in Farmer City for two years before acting as the State Securities Commissioner from 1959 to 1962.

Calvin joined the New York Stock Exchange, Inc. (NYSE) in 1964 as an Executive Assistant of Government Affairs. He was appointed Vice President in 1966 and Senior Vice President for Government Relations in 1977 before becoming the Executive Vice President-International in 1979. He also served the NYSE as a member of the Office of the Chairman and Management Committee from 1979 to 1986.

He has lectured and written on several topics relating to the securities markets and the capital-raising process. He has also spoken at conferences in China, England, Korea, Denmark, Kuwait, Australia and other points around the globe.
