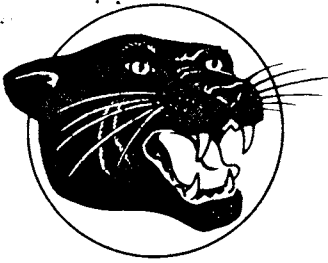

## FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

CHARLESTON, IL--All but assured of a bid to the NCAA Division I-AA tournament, Eastern Illinois University's unbeaten Panthers close the regular season hosting Kentucky State Saturday (Nov. 13) at 1 p.m.

EIU has a 9-0-1 record, the best ever during the regular season, while Kentucky State, which has lost four in a row, is 2-7.

The Panthers, ranked No. 6 last week, could move up in the I-AA poll as Northeast Louisiana, ranked No. 5, lost and Tennessee State, No. 4, was idle.

Twelve teams will be selected for the tournament with first round games scheduled for Saturday, Nov. 27. The top four seeded teams will receive a bye and not play until Saturday, Dec. 4.

"Nailing down a playoff berth and finishing unbeaten are our prime objectives this week," said head coach Darrell Mudra. "We're playing very well right now although we can't afford to turn the ball over quite like we did last week.

"We said before the year started that this could be our best team and thus far the players have risen to the occasion each time . . . during October we had five particularly difficult games against established I-AA teams and we managed to win each one. That's quite an achievement in itself."

EIU's defense, which seems to get better each week, is now ranked No. 2 in scoring defense giving up just 9.7 a game.

The offense, thanks to 559 total yards last week, moved into the top 20 with 363 yards per contest. QB Jeff Christensen (Gibson City) has 1975 passing yards this season and 5987 in his career needing just a handful to top 2000 in '82 and 6000 in a three year career.

Kevin Staple (Markham-Thornwood), junior running back, has 949 yards rushing, needing only 51 to become the sixth Panther to gain 1000 yards in a season.

Kentucky State, which has lost its last four games by a combined score of 178-13, has four rushers between 100-200 yards led by George Richardson.

Split end Darryl Cook has caught 30 passes for nearly 500 yards to lead the Thorobreds offensive attack. The Thorobreds lone wins were 7-0 over Knoxville College and 21-14 over Clark.

#### GAME NOTES

**THE SERIES:** This is the first meeting between these two schools.

**LAST WEEK:** QB Jeff Christensen set passing and total offense records of 409 and 416 yards leading EIU past Southwest Missouri 36-7. Christensen completed 20 of 33 passes breaking his old record of 370 yards passing. He threw touch-down passes of 75 yards to Jerry Wright and 12 to Roger Holoman. The defense had eight QB sacks to push its total to a record 59.

Valdosta State rolled over Kentucky State, 48-13. KSU lost its fourth straight and dropped to 2-7.

**THE COACHES:** EIU's Darrell Mudra, in his fifth year at EIU, is 45-14-1. In his 21st year overall he is 155-64-2 and ranks third among active NCAA I-AA coaches for most victories.

Ron Mitchell, the athletic director and head basketball coach, replaced former head coach Leroy Smith in mid-season. Smith resigned for "personal reasons" after coaching at KSU 13 years.

**11 STRAIGHT:** Dating back to the final game of '82, the Panthers have played 11 in a row without a loss. Although EIU has had three previously unbeaten teams all had a tie which marred a perfect record and none won over eight games so a victory Saturday would give the Panthers their best regular season ever.

#### **CHRISTENSEN**

**STATS:** Jeff Christensen (Gibson City) has moved into 15th placed in NCAA I-AA total offense stats at 195.8. He also has 1975 yards passing and only five I-AA passers have more yards.

**TEAM DEFENSE:** The Panthers are ranked No. 2 in team defense allowing just 9.7 per game. The I-AA record is 6.5 by South Carolina State, impossible to reach. A shutout Saturday would give EIU a season ending 8.8 figure. Western Michigan leads this category at 7.5 so it's doubtful if the Panthers could overtake them.

#### **OFFENSIVE, DEFENSIVE**

**RANKINGS:** Both the total offense and total defense ranks in the top 20 this week. The defense is 17th allowing just 261 yards a game while the offense is 18th at 363 per contest. Southwest Missouri, Nevada-Reno and Harvard are the only other teams to be ranked in both categories.

#### **BETTER**

**PASSING:** The improvement in the passing game is particularly evident the last three contests as the Panthers are averaging 271 yards per contest. EIU amassed a school record 409 against Southwest Missouri, a team that was ranked No. 2 in pass defense in the nation with 99 yards per contest.

WRIGHT'S RIGHT: The emergence of Jerry Wright, sophomore split end, as a premier pass receiver is of prime importance to the upgraded passing attack. Wright, who has started the last six games, has caught 25 for 611 yards during this stretch averaging over 100 yards per contest. In his first four games he caught one for 19 giving him a season total of 26 for 630.

INJURY REPORT: The Panthers top 44 should be ready to go. The only one doubtful is Wes Nixon (Lorain, OH-Illinois Valley CC) who has missed three games with a knee injury but is practicing on a limited basis and could possibly play in the tournament.

MCC TITLE: For the second straight year the Panthers have tied for the Mid-Continent Conference championship, this time with Northern Iowa, at 2-0-1. In five years, EIU has won it outright once (1980), tied twice (1982 & 1981), third (1978) and tied for last (1979). During these five years the Panthers are 12-7-1 in league play, the best won-lost record of any MCC member, past or present.
