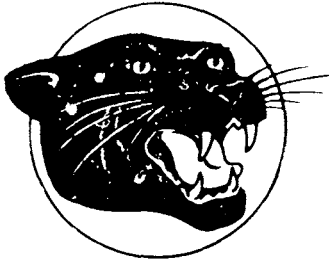

CHARLESTON, IL--Eastern Illinois University President Daniel E. Marvin, Jr. has been named to an ad hoc committee of the American Council on Education (ACE). The committee selected to study problems of inter-collegiate athletic programs is chaired by Derek C. Bok, President of Harvard University. Marvin was appointed by J.W. Peltason, ACE president.

Peltason said the committee will address a number of issues confronting NCAA Division 1 programs.

He said "the effort has grown out of a concern on the part of a number of Division 1 chief executives who believe that the problems require much more vigorous involvement by the presidents if we are to reassert the view that participants in intercollegiate athletics are students first and athletes second."

Marvin indicated he was "pleased to join this prestigious group of presidents and to have an opportunity to represent the smaller Division 1 institutions."

Marvin will attend a meeting of the committee on Nov. 29 in Washington, D.C. Recommendations by the group on eligibility and academic progress will be presented at the NCAA convention in January.

Members of the committee include, among others, presidents of Notre Dame, Pennsylvania, Penn State, Washington, Ohio State, Stanford, Michigan State, Boston, Georgia, Miami, and Harvard.
