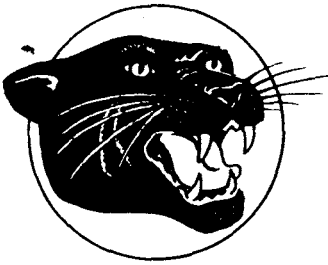

## PANTHERS vs. PENGUINS

**THE GAME:** Eastern Illinois University (4-2) at Youngstown State (3-3), noon CDT, Saturday, October 24, Austintown Fitch Stadium, Youngstown, OH.

**THE SERIES:** Youngstown State leads, 6-2, however EIU has won two of the last three when these two powers were in competition for tournament spots in the NCAA II. In 1978 EIU won a classic playoff semifinal game, 26-22, enroute to a national championship. YSU bombed the Panthers 49-21 in '79 as the Penguins were second to Delaware in the championship.

**LAST YEAR:** Scott McGhee caught two second half touchdowns to establish a new EIU career record for TD receptions and Rich Brown tied a career record for pass interceptions as the Panthers recorded their first regular season win ever against YSU. Jeff Christensen threw for 203 yards and Kevin Staple ran for 109 yards as Eastern had over twice as much total yardage, 485 to 231, although the Penguins ran more offensive plays. Eastern won 32 to 7.

**LAST WEEK:** EIU rebounded with a 20-8 Mid-Continent Conference victory over Western Illinois. Tyrone Davis (East St. Louis-Lincoln) recorded a career high 106 yards rushing with three TDs.

YSU pulled off one of its biggest wins in history, a 24-21 victory over nationally ranked Delaware in Newark, DE. QB Jamie DeVore and tight end John Goode teamed up on a record 85 yard scoring pass.

**THE COACHES:** EIU's Darrell Mudra, in his 20th season, is 144-61-2 overall. At Eastern he is 34-11 in his fourth year.

YSU's Bill Narduzzi, in his seventh year, is 42-28-1. Two years ago Narduzzi also assumed the position of athletic director.

**YSU FACTS:** After a disappointing 2-8-1 season, the Penguins have bounced back to a .500 season highlighted by Saturday's 24-21 upset of Delaware . . . the other two wins were against Cincinnati (19-13) and Akron (34-7) . . . losses were to three nationally ranked members of the Ohio Valley Conference, Eastern Kentucky (26-6), Murray State (13-9) and Western Kentucky (35-14) . . . a former charter member of the Mid-Continent Conference, the Penguins now compete in the OVC where they are 1-3 . . . a ball control offense is led by running back Paris Wicks who has averaged over 90 yards a game with nearly five yards per carry . . . QB Jamie DeVore, a sophomore, has thrown for 610 yards on 37 of 89 with eight interceptions . . . line-backer Joe Schartner leads the defense with 38 solo tackles and six for loss . . . offensively up front the Penguins will dwarf the Panthers as they average 6-3, 250.

MCC 'SWEEP': EIU had both the Offensive and Defensive Mid-Continent Conference 'Players of the Week' for the 20-8 win over WIU.

Running back Tyrone Davis (East St. Louis-Lincoln) rushed for a career high 106 yards and three touchdown runs of one, two, and three yards. He carried the ball 30 times including 19 straight in the second half interrupted by only two punts. Previously this year he had just 24 rushing attempts.

Linebacker Ira Jefferson (Momence) had six solo tackles, two assisted tackles, a quarterback sack and tackle for loss. He also was used for about 30-35 plays on offense as a blocking back for Davis' exploits out of a fullhouse backfield.

NCAA I-AA STATS: The defense continues to rank high in national stats after holding Western to 192 total yards. The total defense is still No. 2 with 188.2 yards per game. Jackson State, which was idle last week, is No. 1 with 185. Both the rushing defense (84.8) and passing defense (103.3) is No. 4. Due to Don Manzke's (Normal) 40 yard punting average the team's net punting figure of 37.9 ranks it sixth. Jeff Christensen (Gibson City) is sixth in total offense with 213.8, all but three yards of that coming via passing.

QUICK FACTS: The Panthers scored their first points of the fourth quarter this season on Davis' final three yard run . . . wide receiver Roger Holoman (Alton) has not caught a pass the last two weeks after getting 11 against Central State . . . however, both slotback Rob Mehalic (Streator-Woodland) and tight end Dirk Androff (Decatur-Eisenhower) have responded with 28 catches between them . . . the defense is averaging just under five QB sacks per game, ahead of the record pace of the '79 team.

COACH DARRELL MUDRA SAYS: "This is an important game for both teams . . . We want to keep our momentum going after a nice win, and Youngstown State wants to get over the .500 mark . . . we played pretty well against Western, but I still think we are capable of achieving more . . . Youngstown obviously played a great game to beat Delaware so that's a real boost of confidence for their people . . . the type that can motivate you for some great things . . . their offensive line is the best we've seen . . . they have size and quickness . . . it'll take a great

effort for our young people to match up with them . . . they also have a real ball control offense with two solid backs in (Paris) Wicks and (Mike) Hardie . . . since I've been here every game has been exciting . . . I don't foresee this one being any different."
