CRAWFORD PROMOTED AND AWARDED TENURE AT EASTERN

CHARLESTON, IL--Scott Crawford, graduate coordinator of physical education at Eastern Illinois University, has been promoted to professor and awarded tenure effective Fall Semester 1993.

Tenure is a status awarded by the Board of Governors Universities upon the positive recommendation of the university president following an extensive evaluation process. It is a relationship of continuing commitment between the university and the employee, benefiting both.

Eastern, located in Charleston, places priority on teaching excellence for a high quality student body in a residential setting and offers faculty a wide range of research and public service activities.

Crawford earned a second class honors diploma in physical education/history from Loughborough Colleges, England, in 1966. He earned his master's degrees in education and physical education from the University of Pennsylvania and Birmingham Universi-

ty, England, in 1970 and 1973, respectively. He earned his doctorate in sport history from the University of Queensland, Australia in 1985.

Prior to coming to Eastern, Crawford was a lecturer at the College of the Bahamas from 1973-1975, a senior lecturer at Otago University, New Zealand, from 1975-1985, and an associate professor at George Mason University, Virginia, from 1985-1989. He has published widely on the topic of sport history in a variety of international and British journals.

Crawford is the son of Mrs. J. Crawford of Scotland, Great Britain. His wife, Penelope, is the director of a summer school program for dyslexics. They have two sons: Simon John, and Marc Alexander.
