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MINUTES OF THE COUNCIL ON ACADEMIC AFFAIRS
July 3, 1986

The meeting was held at 2:00 p.m., July 3, 1986, in the Room 310 of the Physical Sciences Building.

I. Minutes of June 26, 1986.

The spelling of Mr. Raddatz's name was corrected. The statement "Items 1 and 2 are in effect pending Board approval" was moved from Item III to Item IV following ". . . passed unanimously." Also in Item IX, BED 3401, Methods of Teaching Office Skills was corrected to (2-0-1,2) not (3-0-3). Minutes were approved as amended.

IV. New Courses, HIS 4903, Colonial America to 1763 (86-57) and HIS 4904, The American Revolution, 1763-1789 (86-58).

Dr. Hennings, Chair of the Department of History, answered questions of the Council members. Motion for approval of both courses passed with Dr. Hockman abstaining.

Dr. Gerald Sullivan, Chair, introduced Miss Nancy Paule, of the Department of Theatre Arts. They presented the proposal and answered the Council's questions. Motion for approval of the course proposal passed unanimously.

Proposal on Provisional Admissions*

First-time freshmen applicants and transfer applicants with fewer than 15 semester hours of earned credit, who meet all criteria for admission except high school course-specific requirements, will be admitted on a provisional basis.

The progress of students admitted on provisional basis will be monitored carefully by specially designated personnel in the Academic Assistance Center. The courses in which students on provisional admission enroll as freshmen must include courses in the areas where course-specific requirements were not met.

In order to remove provisional admission status, students must complete a course in each area of deficiency with a grade of "C" or better no later than the grading period in which they complete 44 semester hours of coursework. Should such students fail to remove their deficiencies by that time, they will be required to complete satisfactorily an additional course in any remaining area(s) of deficiency. Students will not be permitted to graduate until provisional status has been removed.

*Students who graduated from high school five or more years prior to entering Eastern Illinois University are exempt from course-specific admission requirements.
