Minutes of April 22, 1980

The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m.

The minutes of April 15, 1980, were approved.

COMMUNICATIONS:

1. Lawrence Dennis - minutes of ASUGB meeting, as well as copies of letters to the governor and others about the organization of state university senates
2. Jon Hopkins - to Wood - objection on procedural grounds to Senate's disposal of the Columbus Day issue
3. Wood - to Hopkins - reply that the faculty vote on the Columbus Day break was advisory only
4. Joan Schmidt - to Pres. Marvin - on the disparity between men's and women's athletics
5. Garret DeRuiter - note on the expensive paper now used by the Faculty Newsletter

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

1. Nominations - Cary Knoop - A motion (Knoop/Weiler) that the committee's recommendations for various faculty committees and student faculty boards (see Appendix A) be approved passed on a voice vote.

After some discussion, the following motion (Knoop/Summers)

- passed on a voice vote: that next year's Nominating Committee contact each of these committees and boards (perhaps through a questionnaire) and ask it to spell out its purposes and functions and determine whether it should be retained, put on ad hoc status, or be abolished.
2. Elections - Bill Weiler - A motion (Weiler/Knoop) that the Senate approve the run-off election results published in the minutes of April 15 passed on a voice vote.
  3. Social - Jerry Sullivan - Flowers for the retirement tea will be provided by volunteers. The President, newly-elected senators, and their guests will be invited to the Senate's May social.
  4. ASUGB meeting - Cary Knoop - The April 12 meeting in Springfield had representatives from six campuses. There was discussion of a talk with Senator David Shapiro and the necessity of the committee of senates to deal only with matters affecting all campuses. The group hoped to have 5 to 10 people from each campus in Springfield on April 22. Following a discussion of to what extent the group is anti-AFT, there was a motion (Preston/Knoop) that our Senate withdraw from the ASUGB. Leonard Wood recommended that the motion be tabled to allow faculty time to respond to the suggestion. After further discussion, a motion (Hockman/Laible) to table passed by a show of hands.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Faculty petition objecting to CAA action - At the invitation of the Senate, Steve Whitley (chairperson, CAA) spoke to the issue. Giving a history of the eighteen months of deliberation, Dr. Whitley emphasized that all proper procedures had been followed, that the faculty had been given ample time and opportunity to speak on the issue, that A & S objections had been heard, and that the CAA had reached its determination according to its understanding of what the catalog mandated and what its responsibilities to the overall academic community demanded. He pointed out (1) that there was faculty recognition that the course content in each case was within the realm of social science, (2) that the CAA had determined that the courses fit within the broad definition of G.E. courses, and (3) that the Dec. 12 petition from the social studies departments (similar to the petition to the Senate published in the April 8 minutes) failed to get a majority of CAA votes both as a whole and in its individual parts. In the discussion that followed, there was no suggestion that CAA had not followed proper procedure, but there was much concern in this particular case that social studies departments and/or A & S be allowed to determine whether a course with social studies content but taught outside social studies departments be allowed to count for G.E. social studies credit. The opposing view was that the CAA reviews courses initially to determine whether there's duplication with other courses (whether in different departments or not) and reviews them again to determine if they meet G.E. criteria.

PROGRAM:

1. Annual report from CGS - Kenneth Sutton (chairperson, CGS) - Dr. Sutton reported on program reviews for various departments, BOG requests for annual program revision, policy decisions, program action, changes in the stipend level for graduate assistants, communication between councils, and proposed changes to make CGS work more efficiently. Dr. Wood thanked him for his clear and full review.

The meeting adjourned at 3:40 p.m.

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The next meeting of the Faculty Senate will be at 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday, April 29, 1980, in the Martinsville Room of the Union.
