The band members also have to memorize their music and do not use published music, only arranged. Brawner said he writes about a third of what they use. Al Horney, head of Eastern's Jazz Studies, writes a third, and Brawner receives a third from various sources.

"By using arranged music, the band gets a more distinctive and authentic sound. This is more educational and entertaining, and is a challenge for students to perform different music and drills each week," Brawner said.

The band does not just perform on Eastern's football field but have played for the opening day game at the Chicago Bears Football Team at Chicago's Soldier Field.

"This is a challenge for us. It makes us work hard because we perform in front of 65,000 people," said Brawner.

Eastern's Marching Band also hosts an annual high school band competition. All the members help with the competition which involves 25 area high school bands and give a performance at the end of the competition.

Eastern's band program gives students an opportunity to continue their music education they began in high school.
