CHARLESTON, IL--"Segregation and Conflict in Northern Ireland" is the topic of a lecture on Tuesday, July 15 at 7:30 p.m. in Booth Library Lecture Room at Eastern Illinois University.

The speaker will be Dr. Dominic Murray, statutory lecturer for the National University of Ireland. Murray is the fifth Distinguished Visiting Faculty scheduled during Summer School '86.

A senior faculty member in the Education Department at University College at Cork, Murray will conduct a workshop July 14-17 on education and social conflict.

He has been guest lecturer in Northern Ireland, Britain, Holland and the Republic of Ireland. Murray has also been a speaker on television and radio, including the BBC.

Murray is a scholar of international reputation. His teaching and research specialities include social foundations of education, with emphasis on schools in conflict and values of education.

Two of his books are titled "Education and Community in Northern Ireland: Schools Apart?" and "Worlds Apart: School and Society in Northern Ireland."
