Minutes of February 9, 1982

COMMUNICATIONS:

1. From Nominating Committee--list of members on present committees and the length of their terms. (See attached copy.) Sullivan moved to accept the report. Lynch seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.
2. From Dale Downs--minutes of the COF meeting, February 8, 1982.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Dr. Buchanan reported from the ad hoc Textbook Library Committee. The faculty will be sent a questionnaire which will include the charge to the committee from President Marvin. The committee is contacting other schools in the Midwest to learn what methods of textbook issuance are operating.
2. Rooke reported about the work of the Registration Committee. Information about its work will be available soon for all.

NEW BUSINESS:

Dean Lowell and Mr. Dutler appeared to discuss faculty participation in the athletic facilities on campus. Dean Lowell made the point that a few years ago students reported that since they were paying for the use of the athletic facilities that the faculty should pay for their participation also. Mr. Dutler pointed out all the possible activities and facilities for faculty members. Faculty may participate in all intramural games. Dean Lowell said that philosophically pools and other facilities cannot be reserved for any group because of scheduled classes. Also, there would be too many requests that all could not be accommodated. After some discussion Dean Lowell and Mr. Dutler said they would talk about some more hours for participation by both faculty and students and get back to the Senate.

The Senate went into executive session.

The meeting adjourned at 4:00 p.m.

The next meeting of the Faculty Senate will be on Tuesday, February 16, 1982, at 2:00 p.m. in the Martinsville Room.

During Spring semester, the Faculty Senate will conduct elections for membership on the Council of Faculties, Faculty Senate, Personnel Committee, Council on Academic Affairs, Council on Teacher Education, and Council on Graduate Studies. For convenience, all of the above are designated herein as Councils.

To be nominated for membership on a council, a faculty member must submit or have submitted for him an individual petition containing the signatures of TWENTY eligible faculty (except in the case of area representative nominations for the Council on Teacher Education where TEN are required and in the case of the University Personnel Committee where FIVE signatures of members of the area are required). All petitions must be received by the Chairperson of the Nominations Committee, George Cooper (Blair Hall 210, 1-3726), no later than February 26, 1982, at 5 p.m. The election date is March 17 and 18, 1982, and the run-off election is scheduled for April 7, 1982. Arrangements for absentee ballots will be announced prior to each election.

A faculty member who accepts nomination for one major council (other than the Council of Faculties and University Personnel Committee) shall be ineligible for nomination to any other major council for this election. Current members of major councils are not eligible for nomination to any other major council unless their terms expire with the upcoming election.

Nominators of candidates for area representation (Council on Teacher Education, Council on Graduate Studies, and University Personnel Committee) must themselves serve in the same areas as the candidates that they nominate.

As specified by the Constitution of the Council of Faculties, the following may neither be nominators nor nominees of the Council of Faculties: President, Vice Presidents, Deans, Directors, Associate and Assistant Deans or Directors, Registrar, Business Manager, Executive Assistants, Department Heads, Division Chairmen or Heads.

In the event that a minimum of two nominees for each available council position is not met by the petition method, the Faculty Senate will, by a majority vote, nominate a sufficient number of additional candidates to meet that minimum.

Current members of each council are listed below. An * indicates those whose terms are ending this summer. Newly elected officers will begin their terms Fall semester, 1982.

Once again candidates for the various University Councils will be asked to write brief replies to questions concerning council issues. The questions will be prepared by the Elections Committee of the Senate based on material furnished by the Executive Committees of each council. The candidates' replies will be distributed to the faculty prior to the election. The questions to be answered will be sent to all candidates shortly after petitions are received.
