FAULKNER HONORED

CHARLESTON, IL--Tom Faulkner, a senior speech communication major at Eastern Illinois University, has been selected to serve as a student trustee on the Board of Trustees for the National BACCHUS (Boosting Alcohol Conciousness Concerning the Health of University Students) organization. Faulkner is president of Eastern's BACCHUS chapter.

The Board of Trustees directs the National BACCHUS organization, composed of 350 chapters across the U.S. and Canada. The Board plans all financial matters and sets the budget for the organization. It also disseminates information to the chapters.

Faulkner will also act as a liaison between the board and the six areas he is responsible for, including Illinois and 23 other states.

Faulkner said, "I'm really excited about being selected for the Board. I consider it a great honor, especially since Eastern's chapter is one of three in Illinois and has only been around for two and one-half years."

He said one of his goals will be to develop a membership packet to inform new members about BACCHUS and encourage others to join.

A "Safe Spring Break" program is another project he will work with the Board and chapters to implement.
