From Bill Clark: a copy of a letter to David Buchanan in which he requests statistical data to justify "Comments from faculty indicate that the poor record of the Union Bookstore in obtaining and carrying sufficient copies of supplementary material is a major hindrance to their use." quoted from the Textbook Rental committee's report.

From June Johnson: "I hereby request that the Faculty Senate undertake a study this summer to ascertain the number of department chairmen on staff at full time (i.e., three full months of salary) and how many staff members are teaching in the same department and whether the contract is for full-time, half-time, third-time, etc. I further request that the Senate publish the data in one of the first sets of minutes in the fall semester so that all faculty may be fully informed." By common consent the Senate directed Chair Lynch to seek the requested information via the proper administrative channels.
