1. What campus concerns do you think the Faculty Senate should address? Briefly state your views on these issues.

2. Why do you wish to serve as a member of the University Personnel Committee?

COUNCIL ON GRADUATE STUDIES

1. What criteria would you use to determine allocation of graduate assistantships?
