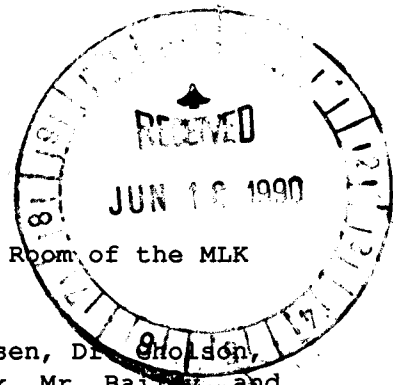
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F: MINUTES OF THE COUNCIL ON ACADEMIC AFFAIRS
June 14, 1990

III. Proposal for New Course, MAT 3XXX, Mathematics and Problem Solving Applications, (90-27), GEN ED - Quantitative Reasoning, and Proposal for an Alternative for Certain Majors.

MAT 3XXX, Mathematics and Problem Solving Applications. (3-0-3). F,S. Mat Prb Solv App. The nature of mathematics and its applications in the fields of management science, probability and statistics from a problem solving approach. Prerequisite: ENG 1002.

Included in this agenda item is a proposal for an alternate way to satisfy this requirement.

Dr. Bates moved and Dr. Buchanan seconded the motion to approve the proposal. Voting will be later.

IV. New Course Proposal, HEC 1XXX, Nutrition and Well-Being, (90-29), GEN ED - Human Behavior.

HEC 1XXX, Nutrition and Well-Being. (3-0-3). F, S. SU. Nutr. Well-Being.

Relationship of nutrition to well-being. Emphasis on the physiological, socioeconomic, psychological, and political factors influencing food behavior and nutrient intake. Evaluation of current nutrition information by application of basic nutrition principles and scientific reasoning. Analysis of individual as well as group food intake. Prerequisite: None.

Dr. Bonnicksen moved and Dr. Sutton seconded the motion to approve the proposal. Voting will be later.

V. New Course Proposal, HEC 2XXX, Changing Gender Roles in Contemporary Society, (90-29), GEN ED - Human Behavior.

HEC 2XXX, Changing Gender Roles in Contemporary Society. (3-0-3). F, S. Changing Roles. An interdisciplinary study focusing on changing gender roles and responsibilities within contemporary society and how the changes affect families and gender relationships. Prerequisite: None.

Dr. Bates moved and Dr. Buchanan seconded the motion to approve the proposal. Voting will be later.

VI. New Course Proposal, HST 2XXX, Principles of Human Health, (90-30), GEN ED - Human Behavior.

HST 2XXX, Principles of Human Health. (3-0-3). F, S, SU. Human Health. A study of health issues and trends, focusing on the interrelatedness of the forces which contribute to human well-being, and the development of the capacity to make informed, responsible decisions affecting individual and environmental welfare. Prerequisites: None.

Dr. Bonnicksen moved and Dr. Sutton seconded the motion to approve the proposal. Voting will be later.

VII. New Course Proposal, PED 2XXX, International Expression for Dance, (90-31), GEN ED - Cultural Experience.

PED 2XXX, International Expression for Dance. (3-0-3). F, S, SU. Inter Exp Dance. A study of major international dance forms, with emphasis on awareness, appreciation, and understanding of their contributions to the arts in past and present cultures. Prerequisite: None.

Dr. Bates moved and Dr. Gholson seconded the motion to approve the proposal. Voting will be later.

VIII. New Course Proposal, PED 3XXX, Fitness for Life, (90-32), GEN ED - Human Behavior.

PED 3XXX, Fitness for Life. (2-2-3). F, S, SU. Fitness for Life. An individualized approach for the motivation, development and maintenance of a life time of wellness through fitness. The course includes a thorough physical fitness/risk factor assessment in the Human Performance Laboratory. Prerequisites: None.

Dr. Sutton moved and Dr. Nilsen seconded the motion to approve the proposal. Voting will be later.

IX. New Course Proposal, LST 3910, Microcomputers in Leisure Studies, (90-33).

Dr. Bates moved and Dr. Buchanan seconded the motion to approve the proposal. Voting will be later.

X. Revised Course Proposal, ACC 2100, Principles of Accounting I, (90-34).

Dr. Buchanan moved and Dr. Bates seconded the motion to approve the proposal. Voting will be later.

- XI. Revised Course Proposal, ACC 2150 Principles of Accounting II, (90-35).
Dr. Buchanan moved and Dr. Bates seconded the motion to approve the proposal. Voting will be later.
- XI. Undergraduate Education Study of Eastern Illinois University, (88-99).
Dr. Shank moved and Dr. Gholson seconded the motion that each integrated core course will be freshman, sophomore, or junior level, with the designation of 1XXX, 2XXX, or 3XXX.

- XII. New Course, ENG 1XXX, Composition and Language, (90-21), GEN ED - Language.
Dr. Robert Funk, and Dr. Quivey, Chair, Department of English, presented the proposal and answered questions of the Council. The motion passed, as amended, unanimously.

This action approves the following to become effective Fall 1991.

ENG 1XXX. Composition and Language. (3-0-3). Comp and Lang.

A course in the reading and writing of expressive, expository, and persuasive essays. Attention is given to effective expression, clear structure, adequate development, and documentation of sources. Prerequisite: ENG 1000 or proficiency in basic skills as determined by the English Department.

- XIII. Revised Course Proposal, ENG 1YYYY, Composition and Literature, (90-22), GEN ED - Language.
Dr. Robert Funk, and Dr. Quivey, Chair, Department of English, presented the proposal and answered questions of the Council. The motion passed, as amended, with a vote as follows:

ENG 1YYY. Composition and Literature. (3-0-3). Comp and Lit.

A writing course designed to improve skills in critical thinking and analytical expression based on the reading of literary texts. Prerequisite: ENG 1XXX.

- XIV. Revised Course Proposal, SPC 1XXX, Introduction to Speech Communication, (90-23), GEN ED - Language.
Dr. Bock, Chair, Department of Speech Communication, and Dr. Perkins presented the proposal and answered questions of the Council.

This action approves the following to become effective Fall 1991.

SPC 1XXX. Introduction to Speech Communication. (3-0-3). Intro Speech Com.

Fundamental principles of selecting, analyzing, evaluating, organizing, developing, and communicating information, evidence, and points of view orally. The course includes instruction in techniques of listening and informative, persuasive, and reactive speaking.

XV. New Course, CHM 4760, Biochemistry II, (90-24).

Dr. Furumo presented the proposal and answered questions of the Council. The proposal passed, as amended, with a vote as follows:

CHM 4760, Biochemistry II. (3-0-3). S. Biochem II.

A continuation of Chemistry 3450 emphasizing mechanisms and control of enzyme action, energetic metabolic pathways, biosyntheses of biomolecules such as nucleotides and proteins, DNA and RNA properties, and hormone action.

Prerequisites: CHM 1310; 1315; (1410, 1415) or (1510, 1515); 3430; 3435; 3450.

XVI. New Course, CHM 4765, Biochemistry Laboratory, (90-25).

Dr. Furumo presented the proposal and answered questions of the Council. The proposal passed, as amended, with a vote as follows:

Introduction to experimentation with biochemical systems, processes, and compounds; identification and quantitative measurement of constituents and transformations in biological systems. Prerequisites: CHM 1310; 1315; (1410, 1415) or (1510, 1515); 3430; 3435; 3450. Current enrollment in CHM 4760 recommended.
