FACULTY SENATE

Minutes of September 6, 1983

COMMUNICATIONS:

1. From Jane Lasky - agreeing with the reorganization of Home Economics and Technology
2. From Barbara Platt - checking on membership on Council on University Planning and Budgeting

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

1. Sullivan and Reed suggested that the Chair of the Senate write a memo to the faculty appointed representatives on Student-Faculty Boards requesting that the minutes of each committee be sent to the Senate and that the senior faculty representative report in person to the Senate once each month concerning the activities of his/her committee. Stevens moved, seconded by Floyd, to accept the above procedure. Motion carried.
2. Coon gave an interim report on the length of the Fall Semester. He has further investigations before concluding his report.
3. Coon pointed out that the last report of the Council of Faculties' study on Faculty Research recommended that any faculty member nominated to or elected to a Council on Faculty Research should have a background in research, a record of active research, and a history of writing proposals for grant funds.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Chair Goodrick reported that R. C. Johnson recommended that the UCLA proposal concerning Frosh eligibility be referred to the Intercollegiate Athletics Board. The Senate concurred.
2. Rooke moved, seconded by Sutton, to strike out the phrase "one of whom shall also be a member of the Nominations Committee" in Section II, B, #5 and 6 of the Senate by-laws.
3. Goodrick reported that the Senate will wait for position papers and any other materials concerning the reorganization of Home Economics and Technology before it takes any action.

The meeting adjourned at 4:15. The next meeting of the Faculty Senate will be on September 13, at 2:15, in the Martinsville Room.
