FACULTY SENATE

October 16, 1984

4. Several expressions of appreciation for Janet Norberg's historical explanation of the events leading to the dining area proposal.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Miller moved, seconded by Stevens, that the minutes of October 9 be approved as ammended. Motion passed unanimously.

Corrections:

page 13, item 4 should be: Stevens reported that Senate subcommittee members agreed that there was no excuse for not having stated procedures for electing administrative replacements. The Affirmative Action Officer said she would convey the opinion of the Senate subcommittee to the Affirmative Action Committee.

2. Student Evaluation of University Services: Nordin reported that students should have the opportunity to evaluate various services provided by the university. Since teaching faculty are already evaluated by students, such services would include: Financial Aids, the Student Union, Library Services, Records, Registration, Intramurals, Housing, Food Services, Security, Counseling, Placement, Health Services, and the International Student Organization. Other Senate members mentioned that the Eastern News, Parking, Maintenance, Advisement, Catalogue format, and Handicap Accessibility be added to the list. At Sutton's suggestion, Senate members Nordin, Miller, and Smith and Student Senator Long volunteered to serve on a subcommittee charged with notifying the heads of various services or areas mentioned above to determine whether or not the services have an evaluation form that provides student input. In consultation with those responsible for the various services, the Senate subcommittee will construct suitable evaluation forms.

3. Faculty Senate Dialogue with the Student Senate: Sutton reported that he and the Student-Faculty Relations Committee met with Student Senate representatives. Sutton noted that student senators applauded the Faculty Senate's position on the pre-payment of tuition. At the

meeting, both faculty and students agreed that an open forum, where the Faculty Senators and Student Senators would discuss three or four topics of mutual interest, should take place on November 6 at 2:00 p.m.

In response to Sutton's report, Norberg moved and Smith seconded that the Faculty Senate encourage faculty participation at the open forum meeting between the Faculty Senate and the Student Senate on November 6. Motion passed unanimously.

The topics of discussion and meeting place will be announced in the minutes of the next Senate meeting.

The meeting adjourned at 2:59 p.m. The next meeting of the Faculty Senate will be on Tuesday, October 23 at 2:00 p.m. in the Martinsville Room.
