OLD BUSINESS:

1. Summer School: Coon reported tha 70% of the students in summer school are juniors, seniors, and graduate students. Since most of the departmental course offerings in the summer session are service courses, majors and minors have difficulty fulfilling departmental requirements. After lengthy discussion Senate members agreed that an increase in junior and senior courses offered in the summer was desirable. Jayne Ozier and Terry Perkins (co-chairs) volunteered to serve on a Senate subcommittee to examine the possibilities for such an increase.

2. Awards Committee Criteria: Ken Sutton asked for imput from Senate members concerning possible criteria for a service award for faculty members. Discussion followed.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Draft of a Proposal for a BOG Policy Restricting Partisan Political Involvement of State Educational Institutions: Senate members agreed to delay the proposal until they hear BOG response to the Senate minutes of November 20, 1984.

2. Declining Minority Enrollment: The Senate will invite the Vice President for Student Affairs, Glenn Williams, to discuss the recruitment of minorities.

The meeting adjourned at 3:37 p.m. The next meeting of the Faculty Senate will be at 2:00 p.m. in the Martinsville Room on December 4, 1984.
