CHARLESTON, IL--The Eastern Illinois University/Community Orchestra will present its first concert of the 1986-87 season in Dvorak Concert Hall at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, Oct. 16, 1986.

The program will open with the "Fanfare to 'La Peri'" by Paul Dukas, followed by the "Concerto No. 4, K. 218 in D Major for Violin and Orchestra" by Wolfgang Mozart.

The final work on the program is the "Symphony No. 1" by Dimitri Shostakovich. Although it was completed when the composer was only 19 years old, it is a mature work that has found a ready place in the orchestral repertory.

Soloist for the Mozart concerto will be violinist Barbara Sturgis-Everett. Dr. Sturgis-Everett, originally from South Carolina, attended the Peabody Conservatory in Baltimore where she studied with artist-teacher Berl Senofsky for five years.

She then attended the College-Conservatory of Music in Cincinnati, where she studied for three years with members of the LaSalle Quartet and completed the Doctor of Musical Arts degree.

Dr. Sturgis-Everett is a member of the Eastern faculty, the Sinfonia da Camera chamber orchestra, and has performed as soloist and chamber musician in 15 states. Her violin is an Austrian instrument made by George Thir in 1758.

The concert is open to the public without charge.
