Minutes of November 11, 1986

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Wohlrabe at 2:00 p.m. in the Martinsville Room of the MLK Union.

I. Wohlrabe dispensed with the regular agenda so that John Reardon could speak to the Senate in regard to The Faculty Dental Plan.

II. The minutes of November 4, 1986, were approved as published.

III. COMMUNICATIONS:

1. Memorandum from Lewis Coon, Faculty Senate appointee for Search Committee Director of The Physical Plant, regarding applicant interviews.
2. Telephone call from Kandy Baumgardner regarding discrepancies in miscellaneous campus handbooks.
3. Memorandum from President Rives regarding Faculty Excellence Awards Committee Nominations.

IV. OLD BUSINESS:

1. Bridgette Chen is not able to come to the Faculty Senate to discuss problems of the international students. After discussion, Wohlrabe appointed Smith, Janes, and North as a committee to meet with Chen.
2. Loudon reported on the progress of the Faculty Morale Committee.
3. Ozier reported on The Search Committee for VPAA. The Faculty Senate will ask for applicants for the position of Vice President of Academic Affairs.

V. NEW BUSINESS:

1. Discussion of Senate support for divestiture of EIU Foundations funds in South Africa. The following motion was made by Smith, seconded by Sutton. The motion passed unanimously.

The Faculty Senate of Eastern Illinois University reaffirms its position taken in 1985 of supporting divestiture by the E.I.U. Foundation from companies doing business in South Africa. The events of the past year have done nothing to impede continued apartheid there, and it has become increasingly evident that virtually all enlightened institutions in

the nation, large and small, have concluded that continuing to do business with that government is morally reprehensible.

The meeting adjourned at 3:05 p.m.
