Motion was made to accept the slate as presented thus far, with additions to the slate to be made where nominees are needed. (North/McMillan) Motion carried. Discussion followed that it is very difficult to get enough candidates for the faculty elections. One suggestion was to involve Deans and Department chairs in recruiting faculty members to run for the positions open. After further discussion the councils and committees could also suggest and recruit colleagues to run for positions on particular councils. It was noted that many new faculty members may not be aware of all the service activities available through the faculty senate elections.

Dr. Schaeffer did note that he will need faculty senators to be present during the elections to hand out ballots, and that two individuals are needed per hour from 9:00 a.m. til 4:00 p.m on the two days of elections.

Evelyn Goodrick also noted that the nomination committee will be meeting after break to go though the openings on the faculty-student boards and make appointments.
