## FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

CHARLESTON, IL--The Eastern Illinois women's basketball team is getting ready for some "g-o-o-d old-fashioned Southern hospitality" this weekend. Southern Illinois University style that is. You know the type I mean . . . with peach preserves, apple cider and historical college basketball.

The Lady Panthers (9-6, 2-4 in Gateway) will take on Southern Illinois (10-5, 4-2 in Gateway) Saturday at 7:30 p.m. in Carbondale. The Salukis hold a commanding 13-0 edge in the series.

"I was especially pleased with the performance of our team against Northern Iowa last Saturday," states sixth-year EIU head coach Barbara Hilke. "We also played good defense against Drake. However, we must put together a complete 40 minutes of basketball to beat Southern.

"Southern has lost a couple of close games in the conference and they are very tough in Carbondale. I feel that we are on the verge of putting two fine halves of basketball together, and if we do, anything can happen in Carbondale. I can't emphasize enough the importance of us playing good sound defense and blocking out on the boards. That is the key."

Hilke's squad is led by book end forwards who have a knack for the books. Senior Toni Collins (Lincoln/Jamaica-Sidell) leads the team in scoring (14.8) and rebounding (7.7). Collins--a two time all-league pick--also recorded a perfect 4.0 GPA in physical education last semester. Junior Chris Aldridge (Taylorville) is the other forward. The all-conference candidate is second on the team in scoring (14.1) and rebounding (7.1). She also registered a perfect 4.0 GPA in physical education last semester.

Slender Sue Hynd (Ottawa) is coming off her finest game offensively of the season. She scored 22 points and grabbed 11 rebounds in the Lady Panthers' 79-59 home win against Northern Iowa. On the season Hynd is averaging 8.8 ppg and 4.3 rpg.

Southern Illinois' "top dog" is pre-season all-league choice Petra Jackson. The sophomore guard is averaging 19.1 ppg and 5.5 rpg. Sophomore forward Ann Kattreh is averaging nearly 13 points a contest. She had a career-high 26 points in a last-second loss to Drake last Saturday night. Six-foot-2 center Mary Berghuis is pacing the squad in rebounding with a 6.2 average.

Charleston, IL (Jan. 19, 1985)--Motivation is something very important to Eastern Illinois women's basketball player Sue Hynd--next to her family and religion. When she wants something badly enough, Hynd will find a way--by hook or crook--to get it.

A case in point: Eastern was down by one point against Eastern Washington with four seconds left in the first OT. The Lady Panthers' Toni Collins was at the free throw line shooting the back end of a one-and one. Collins missed the shot but Hynd wheeled around the player to her right, snatched the board, and got fouled. She calmly stepped up to the charity stripe and canned the front end of the free throw. EIU went on to win in triple-overtime. Nevertheless, Hynd shouldn't have been able to get the rebound to begin with.

"I asked her how she got the rebound against Eastern Washington," states Lady Panther head coach Barbara Hilke after the victory. "Do you know what she told me? 'Nobody in the world was going to stop me from getting that ball! Nobody!'"

The Ottawa, Ill. junior has emerged as a person who wants the ball in certain game situations. She scored eight points in the third extra-session in the win against Eastern Washington. At times on the court she plays as if she is possessed.

Last Saturday night against Gateway-rival Northern Iowa, Hynd led EIU with 22 points and 11 rebounds. It may have been her finest 40 minutes offensively of the season. However, against Drake two days prior, Hynd may have played her finest half defensively of her career. She and teammate Chris Aldridge held Drake's scoring machine to 11 points--14 below her conference-leading average.

"I thought the first-half against Drake was Sue's finest half of her career--defensively," states Hilke. "She played with a lot of determination and fire."

Hynd's basketball season won't end when the Lady Panthers finish the schedule in early March. The slender pivot has been selected for an Athletes in Action squad that will tour Australia this summer. She is anxiously awaiting the challenge. Hynd is averaging 8.8 ppg and 4.3 rpg this season.

The elementary education major has been receiving special tutoring this season in the post by former EIU standout Linda Ellsworth. Ellsworth--a formidable front-line player in her hey day--has given Hynd and freshman Kerry Walsh special attention to the "ins and outs" of playing center.

"Sue has done a lot of goal-setting since Christmas that has really improved her play," admits Ellsworth. "When Sue sets her mind to do something, she will get it done. Sue has also learned to move more around the other players and to think on the court because she isn't as strong as most players."
