Growing in sedge meadow with Thelypteris palustris, Agrimonia parviflora, Equisetum arvense, Galium obtusum, Helianthus grosseserratus, Hypericum sphaerocarpum, Lathyrus palustris, Pedicularis lanceolata, Phlox glaberrima, Veronicastrum virginicum, etc. Perennial herb.
