Afternoon rounds will begin at 1:15 p.m. and awards will be presented at 3:30 p.m. by Charles Colbert, associate vice-president for Academic Affairs.

The tournament is designed as a round robin competition in the morning, with the 16 teams divided into four groups of four teams.

The teams with the best records will then advance to the championship and consolation playoffs (elimination rounds) that will be held in the afternoon.

The teams that place first, second, third, and fourth in the championship bracket and first in the consolation bracket will receive trophies. Individual awards based upon the students' performances in the morning rounds will be given to the most valuable players.
