WARNER SCHOLARSHIPS AWARDED

CHARLESTON, IL--Twenty-two Eastern Illinois University students were recently presented Errett and Mazie Warner Presidential Awards at a ceremony where the late Mr. Warner of Lawrenceville, a 1925 Eastern graduate, was remembered by family, friends and students.

The scholarships are awarded to outstanding juniors, seniors, and graduate students in 17 different academic areas. The endowment which Mr. Warner created has made possible 206 scholarships for Eastern students.

The bequest from his estate provided more than \$750,000 in cash and farm land, the earnings of which fund the annual awards. It is the second largest monetary scholarship provided through the University Foundation.
