IVARIE TO PARTICIPATE IN PROGRAM ON GERMANY

CHARLESTON, IL.--Ted Ivarie of Charleston, dean of Eastern Illinois University's Lumpkin College of Business, is among a distinguished group of American educators and business leaders selected to participate in a special information program in Bonn and Berlin June 16 to July 3.

The two-week program on "Germany Today" is designed to further the mutual understanding of the constitutional and political structures of America and Germany, as well as their social and economic systems and current issues relevant to each nation.

Conducted entirely in English, the program is sponsored by Deutscher Akademischer Austauschdienst (DAAD), a private self-governing organization of the universities in the Federal Republic of Germany. It is the largest German agency promoting international relations between institutions of higher education through academic and scientific exchange.

"Becoming acquainted with leaders and academicians in Germany will facilitate making arrangements for study abroad, internship and faculty exchange programs, as well as articulation of German university programs with those of our school," Ivarie said.

The program, conducted in cooperation with the University of Bonn and DAAD's office in Berlin, features presentations by speakers from a wide variety of institutions and fields, departments of federal and state governments, political parties, labor unions and industry.
