THREE AREA STUDENTS RECEIVE AWARDS

CHARLESTON, IL--Three area students were recently presented awards at the Eastern Illinois University's Lumpkin College of Business annual awards ceremony.

Melissa Patterson, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Kenny Patterson of Noble, received a Eunice W. Dougherty Scholarship. The award, established by a bequest of Ms. Dougherty, is given annually to outstanding juniors enrolled in programs administered through the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences and the Lumpkin College of Business.

Brenda Prosser, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Fred Prosser of Noble, received the Leslie Anne Moore Award. The award is made annually by Dr. and Mrs. John Moore to a junior female marketing student who shows sincere commitment to the profession. The award is accompanied by a stipend.

A 1988 graduate of West Richland High School, Prosser was a junior marketing major in the spring semester. She has been a member of Delta Mu Delta, American Marketing Association, and Collegiate Business Women, and has been on the Dean's List.

Deborah Kuenstler, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel J. Kuenstler of Claremont, received three awards at Eastern Illinois University's Lumpkin College of Business annual awards ceremony.

She received the Mr. and Mrs. William Craig Simmons Scholarship, the Clay/Richland Scholarship and the Jim and June Giffin Scholarship.

The Simmons Scholarship, established by members of the Simmons family, is awarded annually to junior business majors on the basis of outstanding personal character, scholastic achievement and interest in the field of business and business education.

The Clay/Richland Scholarship, established by an anonymous donor, is awarded annually to a resident of Clay or Richland County, Illinois, entering EIU for the first time as an undergraduate in Pre-Business.

The Giffin Scholarship, established in 1988 through the generosity of Mr. and Mrs. Jim Giffin, is awarded to two juniors who are enrolled in a Bachelor of Science in Business degree program in the Lumpkin College of Business and have at least a grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale.

Kuenstler, a 1988 graduate of East Richland High School in Olney, was a junior finance major in the spring semester. She is a member of the Financial Management Association, Collegiate Business Women and Phi Beta Lambda.
