

'Vampire' and 'Psycho' sales steadily increase

Ticket sales for a pair of shows directed by Eastern students are steadily increasing as they approach their opening nights.

"Vampire Lesbians of Sodom" opens at 8 p.m. Tuesday and "Psycho Beach Party," opens at 8 p.m. April 29 in the Playroom of the Quincy V. Doudna Fine Arts Center.

"Vampire," under the direction of senior Stephen P. Carmody, continues to have "pretty steady" ticket sales thus far, said a representative from the theatre ticket

office. "We are almost sold out for Friday's show."

She continued to say that "Psycho" sales are "not too well yet, but hopefully they will pick up as the show gets closer."

The representative assured there are plenty of good tickets available for both shows.

"They're predicting a sellout for a couple of the 'Psycho' shows," said senior Paul Wiemerslage, director of "Psycho Beach Party." "That would be great to see."

"We are offering a door prize for our Sunday afternoon show," he continued.

All shows begin at 8 p.m. with the exception of the Sunday matinee which starts at 2 p.m.

"That's all I can say except please come see it," Wiemerslage said.

"Vampire Lesbians of Sodom" runs through Friday with an additional show on April 28. "Psycho Beach Party" runs through May 3.
