Something new has been added today to the Times-Courier.

To help readers identify the news on several of our pages we have inserted new page headings on page 2 and 3, as well as on the opinions page, family news, entertainment, markets, and lead sports page.

All the local information that appears with Hospital Notes and Siren Report now will appear under the heading of Records.
