## '72 Theater debut

"Come Blow Your Horn," a bright, modern comedy by Neil Simon, will open at 8 p.m. Thursday in the Fine Arts Theatre.

This comedy, the first production of Summer Theatre '72, is a lively battle between the generations. The father of the family is a harried businessman—He owns a wax fruit company where his two sons are employed.

HIS OLDER son Alan is, he says, a bum, being 29 years old and unmarried and leading, as he does, the life of a playboy. When younger son Buddy leaves home to join Alan and learn his ways the trouble starts, and Simon is at his comic best when there's trouble.

Although written and first

produced in 1961, "Come Blow Your Horn" deals with many of the questions which have become prevalent in recent years: the generation gap, differences in life styles, communication barriers, etc.

Simon's method of treating these questions is to find the humor in them, and this method has made him the American theatre's leading modern humorist.
