III. Appointments.

1. Subcommittee on Core Course Prefixes and Numbers.
Dr. Shelton and Dr. Midkiff agreed to serve on the Subcommittee on Core Course Prefixes and Numbers. The appointments were approved by consensus. By request of Dr. Hohengarten, Mr. John Conley, Records Office, was included in the subcommittee. Dr. Evans was asked to convene the committee.
2. Subcommittee for Integrated Core Course Proposal Format.
Dr. Bock and Dr. Wohlrabe agreed to serve on the Subcommittee for Integrated Core Course Proposal Format. The appointments were approved by consensus.

IV. Proposed Adult Student Admission Policy. (95-54).

Mr. Tucker moved and Dr. Cooper seconded the motion to add this item to the agenda. Voting will be later.

Mr. Phillips entered at this point in the meeting.

V. Proposed Revision of High School Subject Requirements. (95-53).

Dr. Frank Hohengarten, Dean of Enrollment Management, and Mrs. Betsy Miller, Records Office, presented the proposed revision and answered questions of the Council. The motion passed, as amended, with a vote as follows:

This action approves the following to become effective immediately:

HIGH SCHOOL SUBJECT REQUIREMENTS:

College-Preparatory English: Four years of English, emphasizing composition, grammar, and literature. As much as one year of the requirement may be satisfied by two semesters in any combination of drama, debate, public speaking or journalism.

College-Preparatory Mathematics: Three years of mathematics, including algebra, geometry, advanced mathematics, or computer programming.

College-Preparatory Science: Three years of natural sciences (biological and Physical), with significant laboratory experiences.

College-Preparatory Social Studies: Three years of social studies, including one year of United States history and/or government.

Electives: Two years of academic or vocational electives.

The university will allow a flexible redistribution for up to three of the 15 units within the subject areas. No more than one unit each (for a total of three) from the categories of Social Studies, Mathematics, Science, and Electives may be redistributed to any of the other five categories of course work. No more than one unit may be applied to any one category to make up a deficiency. If flexible units are utilized, pre-requisites for specific courses may not necessarily be met.

- VI. General Education Assessment Committee Role in Changes Considered by the CAA to the Integrated Core.
Dr. Hanner met with the General Education Assessment Committee to discuss the role of the GEAC when changes in the integrated core are being considered by CAA. Members of the GEAC agreed that the Committee would serve in an advisory role on General Education Policy to CAA and to provide the available assessment data and information.
